STALLS/SHAVINGS/RESERVATIONS:

Please contact the Ford Idaho Horse Park at www.fordidahocenter.com or 208-442-3335 for stall maps, premium stall pricing information, and to make all stall reservations. Standard stall rate is \$215/each (9 nights; Fri Oct 2nd thru Sun Oct 11th) – collected by FIHP. Premium placement stalls are \$25 or \$50 extra. Single day stall rentals are available for \$55/day through FIHP (all overnight horses must be in a stall). Arrivals before Friday October 2nd will be assessed a \$20/day/stall early arrival fee by the FIHP. Shavings are available from FIHP for \$10 per bag, pellets available for \$10/bag, hay is \$13.25/bale. FIHP does not permit the use of outside shavings or pellets. Local horses not stalled at the FIHP shall pay a \$30/horse haul-in fee (one fee for entire show), payable to the show secretary. Full RV hookups are available on-site through the FIHP for \$35 and \$40/night (please book early); additional overnight camper/trailer parking may be available on-site for self-sufficient units through the FIHP for a small fee.

PAID WARMUPS:

The arena will be open Wednesday (September 30th), from 11 AM until about midnight, re-opening on Thursday morning (October 1st) about 5:00 AM. Paid warmups will run on Thursday, October 1st from 6 AM-8 PM. The arena will be open following the last paid warmup and will remain open until about midnight. The arena will then re-open on Friday morning (October 2nd) about 5:00 AM. Paid warmups will run again from 6 AM-8 PM. The arena will be open throughout Friday evening and every evening throughout the rest of the show. Each night the FIHP arena crew will shut down the arena from 2-4 AM as needed to prepare the ground for the next day's classes.

NRHA APPROVED CLASSES:

All NRHA classes, including aged events and ancillary classes, will be awarding trophies based on NRHA guidelines – Lawson, Morrisons, Morgans, and Plaques. All Aged Events and \$2,000 added ancillary classes will pay-out using NRHA payback schedule "B" (deeper payout); all other classes will use schedule "A" (normal schedule).

GWRHA CLASSES:

Membership in the GWRHA is NOT required to enter GWRHA classes. There will be four slates of Ladies and Gents (Sat, Mon, Wed, Fri) and four slates of Mares and Not-Mares (stallions and geldings combined) (Sun, Tues, Thur, Fri). These GWRHA schooling classes can be shown in any legal bridle using one or two hands. These classes will each have "jackpot" payouts and will have circuit prizes awarded for 1st through 5th places (there is no required number of times you must enter the club classes to receive a circuit award). Late entries (post entries after the draw) for all "schooling" classes will go last in the draw rather than first.

"SCHOOLING":

Contestants are expected to run the designated NRHA pattern number assigned to each class however deviations from the designated pattern are allowed in the above mentioned GWRHA "schooling" classes. As a courtesy to the judge, contestants intending to school their horses in the GWRHA "schooling" classes should make their intention to school obvious to the judge at the beginning of their run. Off-pattern schooling runs shall not exceed four minutes. Horses may be excused at any time at the Judge(s) discretion.

FUTURITY/DERBY/MATURITY ENTRIES & DRAWS:

Derby & Futurity horses may be shown either one handed in a bridle or two handed in a snaffle bit or a hackamore. Maturity horses are to be shown one handed. All Derby/Futurity/Maturity entries must enter up one level (e.g. L1 must also enter a L2 or higher, L2 also a L3 or higher, L3 also in a L4 class). Entry in L4 Red Shirt or L4 4 YO Derby classes fulfills 'enter up' criteria. Entry in the NP Prime Time and/or NP Masters Derby classes must enter at least one class in the regular Derby (i.e. L1, L2, L3, or L4) or the L4 4YO Derby [but not required to enter up another class]. The "Red Shirt" Futurity and 4 YO Derby classes are run concurrently with the Open and Non Pro Derby classes. Entries in the Red Shirt class are restricted to four year old horses who were never shown in a futurity their 3 year old year (for additional information regarding the "Red Shirt" Futurity [click here](#)). 4 YO Derby classes are restricted to four year olds only. Regular Derby classes are open to 4, 5, 6, and 7 YOs. Draws will be determined at the draw party. Maturity draws will be done in conjunction with the ancillary classes they are being concurrently run with (drawn the night before). Additional entries will continue to be accepted until the start of the classes however once drawn, late additions will be the first to show. The Derby classes will be run in 2 Sections. The first section will be for those horses specifically entered in ONLY the Red Shirt and 4 Year Old L4 Derby classes. The second section will be comprised of horses that are entered in the 4-5-6-7 YO Derby, Red Shirt and 4 YO Derby horses who cross enter any of the 4-5-6-7 level classes will also go in the 2nd section. Details will be discussed at the draw party.

ADDITIONAL CLASS INFORMATION:

Show entries should be submitted to the office by 5:00 PM on the evening before each show day. The office will close from approximately 5:00 PM to 6:00 PM each day to prepare the draws for the following day. We anticipate the classes and schedule will be posted at approximately 6:00 PM on the evening before each show day (except Derby and Futurity classes which will be determined at the draw party). Class entries will continue to be accepted until before the start of the classes; however, once drawn, late additions will be the first to show. Note that NRHA regulations prohibit refunding of entry fees once drawn. The draw schedule for the main arena will take precedence over the draw schedule in the outdoor arenas, and the draw schedule for Arena #2 will take precedence over that in Arena #3. Management, in its sole discretion, may alter the draw order in the outdoor arena to accommodate timing conflicts arising where a horse and/or rider is scheduled to show in multiple arenas. The classes ran in Arena #2 are NRHA classes and the draw order must be followed very closely with exception only due to the rider/horse not physically being able to be in multiple locations at the same time. IT IS THE RIDER'S RESPONSIBILITY TO REPORT TO THE GATE AND NOTIFY THE GATE STEWARD OF ANY CONFLICTS OR RISK BEING SCRATCHED FROM THE CLASS. "Drag" periods are tentatively scheduled and may be altered from time-to-time after postings as deemed appropriate. Management reserves the right to alter the show, the arena and schedules at any time as circumstances may dictate or as may be deemed appropriate.

LEADLINE CLASS:

A special GWRHA "Pee Wee Reiner"/Leadline class for children 7 and under will be held Friday after the Youth class (approximately 11:00 am). Contestants will be required to enter by 5:00 PM the night before and to submit a short story line in writing ([click here for form](#)). Riders must be accompanied in the class by an adult who will lead the horse and rider at a walk. No "reining" maneuvers will be performed. Special thanks to Debbie Hunter for sponsoring the Leadline class.

OPEN ARENA RIDING SCHEDULE:

Open riding in the indoor arena will be available from approximately 11:00 AM to 10:00 PM on Wednesday September 30th, from 5:00 AM to 6:00 AM on both Thursday, October 1st and Friday, October 2nd and periodically during paid warmups. Paid warmup will get over at approximately 8:00 PM and the Main Arena will be open

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until midnight on Thursday, October 1st. Following completion of paid warmups (approximately 8:00 PM) on Friday, October 2nd, and every evening following each day's classes we expect the arena will remain open throughout the duration of the show; however, the arena will close from 2:00 AM to 4:00 AM each day to prepare the ground for the following day's classes. The outdoor coverall arena will be open all day Thursday and Friday, October 1st and 2nd and after each day's classes in that arena; once the main arena is available for open riding each evening, the coverall arena ground will be prepared for the next day and closed for the remainder of the night. The Stampede outdoor arena (warm up pen) will be open every day.

TROPHIES & PRIZES:

In addition to NRHA classes being awarded trophies based on NRHA guidelines, there will be circuit prizes awarded for 1st through 5th place in all NRHA double-slotted classes and all GWRHA multi-slotted classes, and prizes for 1st through 5th in all single-slotted classes ([see the Class Schedule](#)). There will also be many significant special show and class sponsor prizes awarded including trophy saddles to both the Level 4 Non Pro & Open Futurity Champions, Level 4 Non Pro and Open Derby Champions, and the Rookie II Shootout Champion. Champion buckles will be awarded in all of the youth aged event classes and Champion buckles will be awarded to the circuit winner of the Short Stirrup, Youth 13 & Under, and the Youth 14-18 classes. [The High Point Open and High Point Non Pro riders](#) of the entire show will each be awarded a special prize as well as the owner of the [High Point Horse](#). The NRHA Short Stirrup circuit champion will take home the perpetual/traveling bronze trophy for a year, sponsored by Garden Creek Ranch (Stub and Janice Free). The NRHA Northwest Affiliate Regional Championship Short Stirrup class champion will receive an NRHA ARC Morgan trophy sponsored by Hanson Performance Horses (Dave and Becky Hanson). The NRHA Masters champion will take home, for a year, the perpetual bronze traveling trophy sponsored by Rock Creek Reining Horses (Jackson & Stephanie Porath) and Mountain Crest Cabinets (CJ Parks). BACK AGAIN IN 2020 – ROOKIE 2 SHOOTOUT!!

The top ten circuit finalists from Slate #1 and #2, plus ties, will be able to run in a clean slate final SHOOTOUT just before the Open Futurity finals on Saturday October 4th. The draw order will be "seated", meaning based on the outcome of the circuit; i.e. the 10th place horse will go first, the 9th place will go second, etc. and the top finishing horse from the circuit will be the last horse to go in the shootout. The Shootout Finals is a clean slate (meaning previous scores do not carry over). There will be no entry fees or judges fees associated with the Finals run. Winner will take home a trophy saddle sponsored by Equine Oasis, buckles will be awarded to the top 10 finishers, as well as other circuit awards.

2020 NORTHWEST AFFILIATE REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

HORSE TRAILER GIVEAWAY:

Due to the craziness of 2020, the NRHA Board of Directors ruled that there is NO qualification requirements this year to enter any Affiliate Regional Championship classes that you (and/or your horse) are eligible for. Furthermore, all contestants who receive a score (no zeros or no-scores) in each ARC class will be eligible to compete at the North American Affiliate Championships in Oklahoma City in November 2020. In addition, the NRHA Board of Directors has allowed people to compete in multiple Affiliate Regional Championships this year; the only stipulation is if you won a class at one ARC you are no longer allowed to compete in that specific class at other ARC shows. If you have questions, please contact the Show Manager or Show Secretary. Consequently, since EVERYBODY is eligible to compete in the ARC classes and to win special National sponsored prizes, the 3-Horse Trailer Give-Away will be delayed until 2021.

VIDEO:

[RainDancer Video](#) will provide video recording services and [live web casting](#) of the show over the internet. Their production trailer will be on-site and will offer free viewing and the ability to purchase videos of your runs. A delay video feed station will also be provided near the warmup area. CONTINUED FROM 2019 – Live scoring and Text Message Alert capabilities will once again be available (see web site to sign up for a text message before you or a friend are about to ride in the Main Arena and/or Arena #2). An \$8 video fee will be added by the show secretary for each run performed in the Main Arena. No professional video services (or charges) will be provided for classes ran in the outdoor arenas.

They will also be available to assist with registering horses, transferring papers and collecting memberships.

HORSE OF THE WEST:

Once again, we welcome back Chris Cook and Horse of the West (previously known as NRHA Inside Reining) to record and televise our horse show to the horse community world wide via RFD-TV on cable networks. Be watching for the Low Roller episode approximately one month after the horse show. It will air 4 times, twice on Monday at 12:30 PM and 8:30 PM Mountain Time and then again at the same times on the following Monday. Be looking for it and set your DVR!

FORD IDAHO HORSE PARK RULES:

Dogs are to remain on a leash and under control at all times. NO DOGS are allowed in the Ford Idaho Center Arena or the Sports Center Concession and Office area AT ANY TIME. Please clean up after your animals. All horses to be washed in designated wash areas only (no washing in the stalls or alleyways). No horses allowed in the RV grounds. All overnight horses MUST be stalled (no stalling in or tying to trailers). No outside food, beverages, or alcohol may be brought into any building without the consent of the FIHP. Speed limit 10 mph. Exhibitors and invitees must comply with all FIHP rules and management directives.

Currently face masks are suggested, but not required at the FIHP. Many precautions are being established to help protect contestants, staff, and vendors at the horse show. A complete list of COVID-19 protocol required actions will be provided as we get closer to the show dates.

CHANGES:

As always, the show schedule is tentative and subject to change. GWRHA reserves the right to make changes, cancellations or substitutions at any time. Show management may change, cancel, alter or reschedule classes, arenas or any other show particulars due to weather or for any other reason, in its sole discretion, as may be dictated by circumstances at the time.
